

This appears to be a revised application for a new workshop, for private use only, the previous planning application number 1283/78, which included a new wall. having been refused on the 22nd November. 1978. On the previous occasion, the Committee raised no objections in principle to the proposals, provided that use of the new workshop was limited to domestic purposes only. Upon review and in the light of the refusal of the previous planning application, the Committee feel that the proposed workshop is so great in area as to give rise for concern, particularly in this residential area. In the circumstances, the Committee wish to raise objections to the proposals and also trust that due regard will be taken of objections, if any, from neighbours in the vicinity.
