Subject to compliance with the following conditions:—

- There shall be no excavation for trenches or alterations to existing site levels within 2 m of the trunk of the tree marked 'C' on drawing no 1152/02/C.
- 2. A 1.8 m vertical close boarded fence shall be constructed along the whole length of the northern western and southern boundaries of the application site. The fence shall be sited no closer than 0.75 m to the centre of the existing boundary hedges or the trunks of boundary trees and special care shall be taken to bridge the roots of boundary trees.

The reasons for the foregoing conditions are as follows: -

- 1. To ensure the future retention of the tree, which is protected by a Tree Preservation Order.
- 2. To safeguard the privacy and amenity of the adjoining properties.
