- (3) All planting, seeding or turfing comprised in the approved details of landscaping, shall be carried out in the first planting and seeding seasons following the occupation of the buildings or the completion of the development, whichever is the sooner; and any trees or plants which within a period of 5 years from the completion of the development die, are removed or become seriously damaged or diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with others of similar size and species, unless the local planning authority gives written consent to any variation, and for the purposes of this condition a planting season shall be deemed to commence in any one year on 1 October and to end on 31 March in the next following year.
- (4) The development hereby permitted shall not be commenced until the King Harry Street/Wolsey Road link road has been constructed to the satisfaction of the Local Planning Authority.
- (5) The developer shall construct the crossover to Standards set out in the current edition of Hertfordshire County Council's "Specification for the Construction of Residential Estate Roads" and the development shall not be brought into use until the access is so constructed.
- (6) Sight lines of 2.4m x 35m shall be provided in each direction within which there shall be no obstruction to visibility between 600mm and 2.0 m above carriageway level.
- (7) The gradient of the driveway shall not be greater than 1 in 20 for the first 5 m from the edge of the carriageway.
- (8) No development shall take place until details of the fencing/walling on the Eastern boundary of the site shall have been submitted to and approved by the local planning authority.
