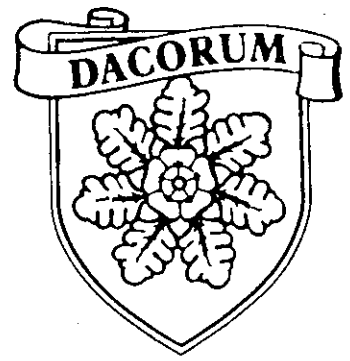

REASONS FOR REFUSAL  
OF APPLICATION: 4/0084/97

1. The site is within the Metropolitan Green Belt, wherein there is a presumption against inappropriate development, and within the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, wherein both development and communications will be subordinated to the basic theme of the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. The area is not to be regarded as one of availability for development and permission will only be granted for new masts if it is satisfactorily demonstrated that a suitable alternative site outside the area is not available. The current proposal is incompatible with these policies as it has not been satisfactorily demonstrated that an alternative site outside the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty is available, or, alternatively that there are difficulties which prevent the sharing of existing facilities.
2. By virtue of its size the site is inadequate to accommodate the proposed development together with landscaping which would be necessary to ameliorate the impact of the development on the natural beauty of the area.
3. Access to the proposed development is by means of Hamberlins Lane along which are high embankments. In order to facilitate access, considerable alterations will be required to provide adequate visibility which will be to the detriment of the character and appearance of the area.
