All works shall conform with guidelines set out in BS 3998:1989 'Recommendations for tree work', and only the following works are hereby permitted:

- a) fell to ground level the leaning Hornbeam;
- b) thin the crown of the boundary Hornbeam by 10% and remove snags and broken branches;
- c) thin the crown of the Beech tree by no more than 10% and raise canopy over the property to give a maximum 3 metre clearance over the roof.

Reason: BS 3998:1989 will ensure proper pruning methods to retain the trees' visual amenity and health. The leaning Hornbeam is part of an old hedge that has been left to grow. This tree has a weak base and has grown at a bad angle because of the shading caused by adjacent trees. The removal of this tree will alleviate its hazard potential and enable adjacent trees to grow. This garden is small with many large trees and hence the shading problem, re-planting this Hornbeam is unnecessary. The remaining Hornbeam and Beech have good form and health and hence only need remedial work.
