Wishes to object. Hoo Wood is in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and any residential development would be contrary to Policy 23 of the District Plan

One letter of objection from a nearby resident

Mainly on the grounds of:-

- (a) It is an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty/Conservation Area.
- (b) When 'The Old Hoo' was built, a belt of trees was planted on the boundary of the Hoo Estate and Gaddesden Estate in order to preserve the natural beauty of the landscape, and to

screen the building from the Gade Valley area - new development would have a disastrous effect on the rural amenities of Great Gaddesden.

<u>CONSIDERATIONS</u> - The site lies in the Chilterns Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty where residential development will normally not be permitted unless there is a proven agricultural or other need. No such need has been put forward in this case.

RECOMMENDATION - That the Forestry Commission be informed that a planning application would have been REFUSED for the following reason:
