- 1. The development to which this permission relates shall be begun within a period of five years commencing on the date of this notice.
- 2. A 4.5m. x 60m. sight line shall be provided at junction of roads 1 & 4 as numbered on drawing by Highways Section. No obstruction more than lm. in height above carriageway shall be planted or erected within the visibility splays.
- 3. Adequate arrangements shall be made to the satisfaction of the Local Planning Authority for the protection of all trees on the site which are to be retained to prevent damage during constructional works. Any trees accidentally damaged shall be replaced by approved species in the first planting season thereafter.
- 4. The garages hereby permitted shall be used for domestic purposes only, incidental to the enjoyment of the dwellings within the same curtilage and for no other purpose.
