## CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPLICATION: 4/00290/99/OUT

1. Approval of the details of the siting, design and external appearance of the buildings, the means of access thereto and the landscaping of the site (hereinafter called "the reserved matters") shall be obtained from the local planning authority in writing before any development is commenced.

<u>Reason</u>: To comply with the provisions of Section 92 (2) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

2. Application for approval of the reserved matters shall be made to the local planning authority before the expiration of three years from the date of this permission.

<u>Reason</u>: To comply with the provisions of Section 92 (2) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

3. The development hereby permitted shall be begun either before the expiration of five years from the date of this permission, or before the expiration of two years from the date of the approval of the last of the reserved matters to be approved, whichever is the later.

Reason: To prevent the accumulation of planning permission; to enable the Council to review the suitability of the development in the light of altered circumstances and to comply with the provisions of Section 92 (2) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

4 The details to be submitted for the approval in writing of the local planning authority in accordance with Condition (1) above shall include a scheme indicating all of the proposed means of enclosure within and around the site whether by means of walls, fences or hedges. The approved means of enclosure round the external boundaries of the site shall be constructed, erected or planted prior to the commencement of other construction work on site and the approved means of enclosure within the site shall be constructed, erected or planted at the same time as the buildings to which it relates are constructed.

<u>Reason</u>: To ensure that the details and appearance of the development are acceptable to the local planning authority.

5. Details submitted in accordance with condition 1 of this permission shall include detailed proposals for vehicle parking within the site in accordance with standards adopted by the local planning authority.

<u>Reason</u>: To ensure the adequate and satisfactory provision of off-street vehicle parking facilities.

6. No development shall take place until details of the proposed slab levels of the buildings in relation to the existing and proposed levels of the site and the surrounding land have been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. The buildings shall be constructed with the approved slab levels.

<u>Reason</u>: For the avoidance of doubt and to ensure a satisfactory form of development.

7. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 (or any Order revoking or re-enacting that Order) (with or without modification) no development falling within the following Classes of the Order shall be carried out without the prior written approval of the local planning authority:

Schedule 2 Part 1 Classes A, B, C, D, E, F, G and H; Part 2 Classes A, B and C.

<u>Reason</u>: To enable the local planning authority to retain control over the development in the interests of safeguarding the residential and visual amenity of the locality.

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
