PROPOSED NURSERY SCHOOL AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

FORMER GROUNDS MAINTENANCE DEPOT, HEATH LANE, HEMEL HEMPSTEAD (4/377-94)

1. **LANDSCAPING**

The tree protection measures and landscaping shall be carried out in accordance with the details shown on drawings numbered D/0057/01/LA/A and D0057/02/LA/A and the landscaping scheme shall be completed before the occupation of any part of the development hereby permitted, unless the period is extended in writing by the County Planning Authority. Any tree or shrub shown as to be retained but which dies within three years of completion of the development or any new tree or shrub which is severely damaged or dies within three years of planting shall be replaced during the first available planting season to the satisfaction of the County Planning Authority.

Reason To minimise the loss of existing trees and ensure the adequate and satisfactory landscaping of the site in the interests of the amenity of the area.

2. SOAKAWAYS

No soakaway shall be constructed such that it penetrates the water table and none shall in any event exceed three metres in depth below existing ground level.

Reason To prevent pollution of groundwater in accordance with the requirements of the National Rivers Authority.
