the reasons for the Council's decision to grant listed building consent for the works proposed subject to

- to allow a longer period for the giving of a notice of appeal and he will exercise his power in cases where he
- s satisfied that the applicant has deferred the giving of notice because negotiations with the local planning authority in regard to the proposed works are in progress.
- If listed building consent is refused, or granted subject to conditions whether by the local planning authority or by the Secretary of State for the Environment, and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonably beneficial use in its existing state and cannot be rendered capable of easonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any works which have been or would be permitted, he may erve on the council of the county district, in which the land is situated a listed building purchase notice equiring that council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Section 190 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971.
- In certain circumstances, a claim may be made against the local planning authority for compensation, where permission is refused or granted subject to conditions by the Secretary of State on appeal or on a eference of the application to him. The circumstances in which such compensation is payable are set out n section 171 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971.

Attention is drawn to Section 55(2)(b) of the Act, the effect of which is that demolition may not be indertaken (despite the terms of the consent granted by the local planning authority) until notice of the proposal has been given to the Royal Commission on Historical Monuments, Fortress House, 23 Saville Row, London W1X 2HE, and the Commission subsequently have either been given reasonable access to the building for at least one month following the grant of consent, or have stated that they have completed their record of the building or that they do not wish to record it.
