TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990, SECTION 78 AND SCHEDULE 6 APPEAL BY DIANA JUNE DAVIES APPLICATION NO: 4/0556/94

- 1. I have been appointed by the Secretary of State for the Environment to determine this appeal against the decision of the Dacorum Borough Council to refuse planning permission in respect of an application for the installation of an all-weather exercise arena on land at Corner Farm, Gaddesden Row, Hemel Hempstead. I have considered the written representations made by you and by the Council. I inspected the site on 29 November 1994.
- 2. The development plan policies relevant to my consideration of this appeal are those of the County Structure Plan and the Dacorum Borough Local Plan, a review of the former District Plan now at the final statutory stage and therefore carrying significant weight. The appeal site falls within the Chilterns Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB), where the prime consideration of development plan policies is the preservation of the area's beauty, in addition to general policies for the protection of the countryside. Local plan policy 76 specifically relates to equestrian activities and states that new built facilities will not be acceptable in the AONB.
- 3. Bearing these policies in mind, from what I saw during my visit and after reading the written representations, I consider the main issue to be the effect of the proposed development on the character and appearance of the area.
- 4. The appeal site lies in very attractive open countryside where there is sporadic development including a group of buildings at Corner Farm to the west and the Stags End Equestrian Centre to the north-east. The site comprises part of a paddock which runs along the north-west side of Gaddesden Lane, behind a hedge with several trees. To the north-west is a wooden stable building, further fenced paddocks and, beyond a boundary hedge pagricultural land. Although there are horse jumps, drums and cones conschessappeal site and adjoining land these are not permanent structures,



and the site is essentially a grass paddock which forms an integral part of the open countryside. The proposed exercise arena would replace the existing grass surface with sand. Whilst I acknowledge that the grass could become worn with heavy use or churned during wet weather, although I saw no evidence of this at the time of my visit, I consider that the proposed surface would represent an alien feature which would appear incongruous in views of the site and the land beyond from Gaddesden Lane. Consequently, it is my opinion that because of its size and appearance the proposed development would significantly harm the character of an area of open countryside which has AONB status, thereby conflicting with the objectives of the development plan policies referred to earlier in my letter.

- 5. I can appreciate your client's wish to provide a safe, dry surface for her daughter to exercise and jump her pony, but neither these personal circumstances nor any of the other matters raised outweigh the planning objections to this proposal.
- 6. For the above reasons, and in exercise of the powers transferred to me, I hereby dismiss this appeal.
