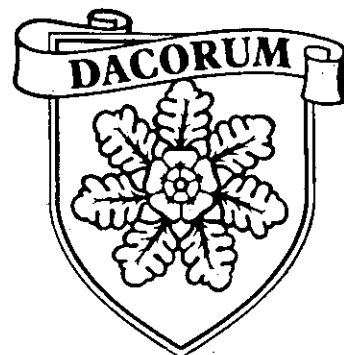

1. The development to which this permission relates shall be begun within a period of five years commencing on the date of this notice.

Reason: To comply with the provisions of s.91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

2. This permission does not relate to the formation of any of the infill areas shown hatched yellow on Drawing No. 501.02.20 and these areas shall at all times be retained as grass.

Reason: To safeguard the setting of the Church and for the avoidance of doubt.

3. The development hereby permitted shall not be commenced until samples of the stone aggregate slabs and setts and salvaged bricks have been submitted to and approved by the local planning authority and there shall be no variation of the approved materials thereafter unless otherwise agreed.

Reason: To safeguard the setting of the Church and for the avoidance of doubt.

4. No development shall be carried out until details/design of the bollards and kerbing referred to by Drawing No. 501.02.20 shall have been submitted to and approved by the local planning authority.

Reason: To safeguard the setting of the Church and for the avoidance of doubt.

5. The new brick piers shall be capped with stone and no development shall be carried out until details/design of the piers have been submitted to and approved by the local planning authority.

Reason: To safeguard the setting of the Church and for the avoidance of doubt.

6. This permission does not relate to the approval of the footpath lighting, details of which shall be submitted to the local planning authority.

Reason: To safeguard the setting of the Church and for the avoidance of doubt.
