REASONS FOR REFUSAL APPLICABLE TO APPLICATION: 4/0625/99OUT

Date of Decision: 27 May 1999

1. The site is within the Metropolitan Green Belt on the adopted Dacorum Borough Local Plan wherein permission will only be given for use of land, the construction of new buildings, changes of use of existing buildings for agricultural or other essential purposes appropriate to a rural area or small scale facilities for participatory sport or recreation. The proposed development is inappropriate in the Green Belt and exceptional circumstances would need to be proved to warrant an exception to this policy. There are no very special circumstances to justify an exception to Government or Development Plan Policies.
2. The proposed development would be a substantial urban intrusion into the generally open landscape and would be contrary to the purpose of including land in the Green Belt.
3. The proposed alterations to the access and the development of this land would create additional slowing down and turning movements within the A5(T), where vehicle speeds are high.
4. The applicant does not control the land required to supply the correct visibility splays, and is therefore unable to satisfy the basic safety requirements for the setting out and provision of an altered access.
5. The slowing down and turning movement of HGVs and other vehicles at this location would create a road safety hazard because of the speed and quantity of vehicles using the A5 trunk road.
