REASONS FOR REFUSAL APPLICABLE TO APPLICATION: 4/00655/99/FHA

- 1. The application site is located in the Metropolitan Green Belt on the adopted Dacorum Borough Local Plan and the Dacorum Borough Local Plan 1991-2011 Deposit Draft. Within the Green Belt, planning permission will only be granted for appropriate development, in accordance with national advice contained in Department of the Environment Planning Policy Guidance Note 2 Green Belts, Policy 3 of the adopted Dacorum Borough Local Plan and Policy 3 of the Dacorum Borough Local Plan 1991-2011 Deposit Draft. Policy 20 of the Dacorum Borough Local Plan (and Policy 23 of the Dacorum Borough Local Plan 1911-2011 Deposit Draft) allows for small scale extensions to existing dwellings in the Green Belt, and ancillary accommodation related to existing residential properties may be considered acceptable under this policy. However, the proposed development is excessive in size, scale and bulk, and is therefore contrary to national policy guidance in PPG 2 and local planning policies for the area.
- 2. The proposed development by reason of its size, scale and bulk and its relationship to the main house would have a seriously detrimental effect on the setting of the house, which is a listed building.
- 3. The proposed development would have an adverse effect on the hedgerow on the boundary with Bovingdon Footpath No. 30, and on the Oak tree adjacent to the footpath, to the detriment of the general character and amenity of the area.
