1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of five years from the date of this permission.

<u>Reason</u>: To comply with the requirements of Section 91 (1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

2. Notwithstanding the details shown on Drawing No. JRW/1077, this planning permission does not extend to the approval of the position of the underground irrigation tank, precise details of which shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority before it is installed. Installation shall be in accordance with the approved details.

<u>Reason</u>: To ensure a satisfactory development and to avoid harm to boundary vegetation.

3. No development shall take place until a wheel washing facility shall have been provided within the existing car park shown hatched orange on Drawing No. JRW/1077, and this facility shall be retained for the entire duration of the lorry movements involved in the development.

Reason: To prevent the deposit of mud on the public highway.

4. Lorry movements into and out of the site shall not take place between 8 am and 9 am or between 5 pm and 6 pm on Mondays to Fridays, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the local planning authority.

Reason: To avoid congestion on the local road network at peak times.
