In pursuance of their powers under the above-mentioned Acts and the Orders and Regulations for the time being in force thereunder, the Council hereby permit, in accordance with the provisions of Article 5(2) of the Town and Country Planning General Development Orders 1977-81---, the development proposed by you in your outline application dated 6th June 1985 and received with sufficient particulars on 7th June 1985 and shown on the plan(s) accompanying such application, subject to the following conditions:

The development hereby permitted shall not be carried out otherwise than in accordance with detailed plans and drawings showing the siting, layout, design, landscaping and external appearance of the building(s) and the means of access thereto which shall have been approved by the local planning authority, before any development is commenced.

2 (a) Application for approval in respect of all matters reserved in Condition 1 above shall be made to the local planning authority within a period of .3. years commencing on the date of this notice.

(b) The development to which this permission relates shall be begun by not later than whichever is the later of the following dates:—

(i) the expiration of a period of . . 5 years, commencing on the date of this notice.

(ii) the expiration of a period of . .2 years commencing on the date upon which final approval is given by the local planning authority or by the Secretary of State or, in the case of approval given on different dates, the final approval of the last such matter to be approved by the local planning authority or by the Secretary of State.

The landscaping details submitted in accordance with condition (1) hereof shall include indication of all existing trees and hedgerows on the land and details of those to be retained, together with measures for their protection during the course of the development.

4 All planting, seeding and turfing comprised in details submitted in accordance with condition 1 and 3 hereof shall be carried out not later than the first planting and seeding seasons following the first rateable occupation of the buildings hereby permitted and any trees or plants which, within a period of five years from the completion of the development die, are removed or become seriously damaged or diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with others of similar size and species unless the local planning authority gives written consent to any other variation.

(3) If permission to develop land is refused or granted subject to conditions, whether by the local planning authority or by the Secretary of State for the Environment, and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonably beneficial use in its existing state and cannot be rendered capable of reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted he may serve on the Common Council, or on the Council of the county borough, London borough or county district in which the lead is situated as the county borough. district in which the land is situated, as the case may be, a purchase notice requiring that council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Part IX of the Town and County Planning Act 1971 accordance with the provisions of Part IX of the Town and County Planning Act 1971.

(4) In certain circumstances, a claim may be made against the local planning authority for compensation, where permission is refused or granted subject to conditions by the Secretary of State on appeal or on a reference of the application to him. The circumstances in which such compensation is payable are set out in section 169 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

The statutory requirements are those set out in section 36(7) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, namely sections 29(1), 30(1), 67 and 74 of the Act.
