

REASONS FOR REFUSAL

- 1. The site is within the Metropolitan Green Belt on the adopted Dacorum District Plan wherein permission will only be given for use of land, the construction of new buildings, changes of use of existing buildings for agricultural or other essential purposes appropriate to a rural area of small scale facilities for participatory sport or recreation. No such need has been proven and the proposed development is unacceptable in the terms of this policy. There is already adequate land available to meet the needs for residential development in the Dacorum area in accordance with the requirements of the County Structure Plan 1986 Review.
- 2. Notwithstanding its semi-derelict condition, the site, by reason of its location abutting the south-eastern built-up edge of Berkhamsted, forms part of an important visual and transitionary buffer between the urban area and open countryside. The proposal would result in the partial encroachment of this buffer to the detriment of the character of this semi-rural edge and if permitted would encourage similar proposals on adjoining land which would result in further urbanisation of this visually important wedge of land.
- 3. The additional traffic generated by the proposed development on Bank Mill Lane, which is of inadequate width, is likely to give rise to conditions prejudicial to highway safety. The provision of road works which would be required to upgrade the road would be severely detrimental to the rural character of the area.
- 4. The provision of adequate sight lines associated with the proposed vehicular accesses would necessitate the removal of trees to the detriment of the overall appearance of Bank Mill Lane.
- 5. It is the Council's stated policy in the Dacorum Borough Local Plan Deposit Draft that development adjoining the Grand Union Canal will be expected to make a positive contribution to the canalside environment. The proposals by virtue of their design and scale are not appropriate to the environmental character of the canal.
