Proposed 5 Storey Hospital Block - West Herts Wing,
Hemel Hempstead General Hospital.

Further to your Notice of Proposed Development in respect of the above scheme, this matter was considered by the Council's Development Control Committee on 3 December 1981. The views of the local planning authority are as follows:-

Whilst the Council welcome the proposal to extend the hospital in principle, they are greatly concerned as to the manner in which the scheme has been conceived, which involves the erection of a 5 storey building in an already cramped part of the site. The Council is mindful of the designation of an area of approximately 23 acres allocated for hospital purposes immediately to the south-east of the present hospital complex.

Concern was also expressed as to the siting of a staircase projection within approximately 1.5 metres of the pavement on King Harry Street almost abutting the proposed widening line, and the prejudicial effect this would have on any further widening of King Harry Street should this become desirable following pedestrianisation of Marlowes.

I would also inform you that this matter will be referred to the Council's Hospital Sub-Committee, as a result of which further observations may follow.
