The reasons for such disapproval are as follows:—

- The access to plot 3 is unsatisfactory as visibility sight lines required to meet adopted standards cannot be achieved within the boundaries of the site. Without such visibility splays, it is the opinion of the local planning authority that the proposed access would be prejudicial to the safety and free flow of traffic and pedestrians on the adjacent highway.
- The proposed development will result in the loss of an excessive number of trees included within a tree preservation order, and such loss will adversely affect the amenities of the locality.

- (1) If the applicant wishes to have an explanation of the reasons for this disapproval it will be given on request and a meeting arranged if necessary.
