In pursuance of their powers under the above-mentioned Acts and the Orders and Regulations for the time being, in force thereunder, the Council hereby permit the development proposed by you in your application dated 8.8.86 and received with sufficient particulars on 11.8.86 and shown on the plan(s) accompanying such application, subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) The development to which this permission relates shall be begun within a period of ... 5 ... years commencing on the date of this notice.
- (2) No work shall be started on the development hereby permitted until details of materials to be used externally shall have been submitted to and approved by the local planning authority, and the development hereby permitted shall be carried out in the materials so approved.
- (3) Adequate arrangements shall be made to the satisfaction of the local planning authority for the protection of all trees on the site which are to be retained to prevent damage during constructional works. Any trees accidentally damaged shall be replaced by approved species in the first planting season thereafter.
- (4) No development shall take place until there has been submitted to and approved by the local planning authority a scheme of landscaping, which shall include indications of all existing trees and hedgerows on the land, and details of any to be retained, together with measures for their protection in the course of development, and details of numbers, species and proposed planting location of all new trees shrubs and hedgerows.

## NOTE

(1) If the applicant wishes to have an explanation of the reasons for this decision it will be given on request and a meeting arranged if necessary.

(2) If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the local planning authority to refuse permission or approval for the proposed development, or to grant permission or approval subject to conditions, he may appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment, in accordance with section 36 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within six months of receipt of this notice. Appeals must be made on a form which is obtainable from the Secretary of State for the Environment, Marsham Street, London, S.W.1.) The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of a notice of appeal but he will not normally be prepared to exercise this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal. The Secretary of State is not required to entertain an appeal if it appears to him that permission for the proposed development could not have been granted by the local planning authority, or could not have been so granted otherwise than subject to the conditions imposed by them, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of the development order, and to any directions given under the order.

(3) If permission to develop land is refused, or granted subject to conditions, whether by the local planning authority or by the Secretary of State and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonably beneficial use in its existing state and cannot be rendered capable of reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted, he may serve on the Common Council, or on the Council of the county, borough; London borough or county district in which the land is situated, as the case may be, a purchase notice requiring that council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Part IX of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

(4) In certain circumstances, a claim may be made against the local planning authority for compensation, where permission is refused or granted subject to conditions by the Secretary of State on appeal or on a reference of the application to him. The circumstances in which such compensation is payable are set out in section 169 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

- All planting, seeding or turfing comprised in the approved details of landscaping, shall be carried out in the first planting and seeding seasons following the occupation of the buildings or the completion of the development, whichever is the sooner; and any trees or plants which within a priod of 5 years from the completion of the development die, are removed or become seriously damaged or diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with others of similar size and species, unless the local planning authority gives written consent to any variation, and for the purposes of this condition a planting season shall be deemed to commence in any one year on 1 October and to end on 31 March in the next following year.
- The floor levels of the development is in relation to existing highways (6) shall be agreed with the local planning authority before any work is commenced on site.
- The development hereby permitted shall not be occupied until the turning space shown on plan 4/1144/86 shall have been provided and shall thereafter be maintained at all times.
- The road hereby permitted shall be constructed in accordance with **(8)** plans, sections and details which shall be submitted to, and approved, by the local planning authority before any works is commenced on site.
  - (9) The development hereby permitted shall not be occupied until the arrangements for vehicle parking, shown on Plan 4/1144/86 shall have been provided and they shall be maintained at all times thereafter.
  - (10) The development hereby permitted shall not be occupied until a 4.5m x 35m visibility sight line in a north easterly direction at the junction of Ravens Lane/Holliday Street and a 1.8m wide footpath along Ravens Lane shall have been laid out and substantially constructed to the satisfaction of the local planning authority and the sight lines be kept clear and available for proper use at all times.
