In pursuance of their powers under the above-mentioned Acts and the Orders and Regulations for the time being in force thereunder, the Council hereby permit the development proposed by you in your application dated 24th October 1977 and received with sufficient particulars on 26th October 1977 and shown on the plan(s) accompanying such application, subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) The development to which this permission relates shall be begun within a period of 5 years commencing on the date of this notice.
- (2) For a period of ten years from the date of this permission, Unit 1 shall be occupied only by Data Efficiency Limited, or by such other person, firm or company occupying on January 1st 1976 a building within the County of Hertfordshire which is used for general or light industrial purposes within the meaning of those terms in the Town and Country Planning (Use Classes) Order 1972, and who shall have received the prior written approval of the Local Planning Authority.
- (3) No work shall be started until a comprehensive scheme of landscaping, including existing trees, for the site shall have been submitted to, and approved by, the Local Planning Authority. This landscaping scheme shall be implemented strictly in accordance with the approved details in the first planting season following the occupation of the development and shall be maintained at all times thereafter to the reasonable satisfaction of the Local Planning Authority.
- (4) Noise from operations on these premises shall not exceed 51dB(A) as measured at the northern and eastern boundaries of the land allocated for industrial purposes on the approved County Development Plan between the hours of 0700 and 1900 Monday to Friday and 0700 and 1300 Saturday. At all other times the noise level at those boundaries shall not exceed 46dB(A).

- 5/ The use hereby permitted shall not be implemented until details of extraction equipment to control the emission of fumes from the stove enamelling process shall have been submitted to, and approved by, the Local Planning Authority.

The reasons for the Council's decision to grant permission for the development subject to the above conditions are:-

- (1) To comply with the requirements of Section 41 of the Town & Country Planning Act, 1971.
- 2) To comply with policies adopted by the Local Planning Authority to restrict and contain development to that essential to meet local needs as expressed in the submitted Structure Plan for the County of Hertfordshire.
- 3) To maintain and enhance the visual amenity of the area.
- 4, and 5. In the interests of general amenity and in particular those of the occupants of nearby dwellings.

NOTE

(1) If the applicant wishes to have an explanation of the reasons for this decision it will be given on request and a meeting arranged if necessary.

(2) If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the local planning authority to refuse permission or approval for the proposed development, or to grant permission or approval subject to conditions, he may appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment, in accordance with section 36 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within six months of receipt of this notice. Appeals must be made on a form which is obtainable from the Secretary of State for the Environment, Whitehall, London, S.W.1. The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of a notice of appeal but he will not normally be prepared to exercise this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal. The Secretary of State is not required to entertain an appeal if it appears to him that permission for the proposed development could not have been granted by the local planning authority, or could not have been so granted otherwise than subject to the conditions imposed by them, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of the development order, and to any directions given under the order.

(3) If permission to develop land is refused, or granted subject to conditions, whether by the local planning authority or by the Secretary of State and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonably beneficial use in its existing state and cannot be rendered capable of reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted, he may serve on the Common Council, or on the Council of the county borough, London borough or county district in which the land is situated, as the case may be, a purchase notice requiring that council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Part IX of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

(4) In certain circumstances, a claim may be made against the local planning authority for compensation, where permission is refused or granted subject to conditions by the Secretary of State on appeal or on a reference of the application to him. The circumstances in which such compensation is payable are set out in section 169 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.
