REASONS FOR REFUSAL

- 1. The proposed walkway by reason of its length, siting and design would appear incongruous and out of place in this prominent location and would, therefore, be detrimental to the character and appearance of the area.
- 2. The formation of the proposed footway would require the removal of a landscape strip and its replacement with slab paving. The construction of the proposed walkway is likely to result in damage to and removal of an existing avenue of lime trees and removal of low level shrub planting. Bearing in mind the height of the proposed walkway and its proximity to existing trees, it is unlikely that the trees could be realistically retained following the completion of the development proposed. The loss of existing landscaping on the site would be detrimental to the environmental character and visual amenity of the site, contrary to the aims of Policies 8 and 9 of the Dacorum Borough Local Plan.
- 3. The proposed additional arm on the roundabout shown on drawing no.2086.C.018 LA Ref.4/1331/95 does not satisfy current highway standards in respect of gradient and visibility and is therefore likely to give rise to conditions prejudicial to highway safety.
- 4. The proposed pedestrian crossing is located on a bend in close proximity to the exit to the petrol filling station where visibility is poor. The conflict between pedestrians and vehicles leaving the filling station is likely to give rise to conditions detrimental to highway safety.
