**1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of five years from the date of this permission.**

Reason: To comply with the requirements of Section 91 (1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

**2. No materials, plant, soil or spoil shall be stored underneath the canopy of any tree on the site or against any of the beech hedging which is shown for retention on the approved Drawing No. 252 C.**

Reason: In order to ensure that damage does not occur to the trees or hedging during building operations.

**3. The existing trees along the front boundary and beech hedging along the front and eastern boundaries shown for retention on the approved Drawing No. 252 C shall be protected during the whole period of site excavation and construction by the erection and retention of a 1.5 metre high chestnut paling fence on firm stake supports, not more than 3 metres apart and positioned beneath the outermost part of the branch canopy of the trees, and 1 metre from the beech hedge.**

Reason: In order to ensure that damage does not occur to the trees or hedging during building operations.

**4. No hardsurfacing shall be constructed within a 4 metre radius of the trunk of the Cherry tree along the front boundary.**

Reason: To maintain the health and a satisfactory appearance of the tree and in the interests of the amenities of the area.
