In pursuance of their powers under the above-mentioned Acts and the Orders and Regulations for the time being in force thereunder, the Council hereby grants listed building consent to the works described above and proposed by you in your application dated 22 July 1988 and received with sufficient particulars on ... 25 July 1988 (amended 14.12.88) and shown on the plan(s) accompanying such application subject to the following conditions:

- (1) The works to which this consent relates shall be begun within a period of five years commencing on the date of this notice.
- (2) The external materials to be used on the works hereby granted consent shall comprise plain clay tiles on the roof of the barn and garage, dark-stained timber boarding and Bucks multi facing bricks on the external walls of the barn, or such other materials as may be agreed in writing with the local planning authority.
- (3) No works shall take place until there has been submitted to and approved by the local planning authority a scheme of landscaping, which shall include indications of all existing trees and hedgerows on the land, and details of any to be retained, together with measures for their protection in the course of the works, and details of numbers, species and proposed planting location of all new trees, shrubs and hedgerows.

The reasons for the Council's decision to grant listed building consent for the works proposed subject to the above conditions are:

- (1) To comply with the provisions of s.56A of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.
- (2) To ensure a satisfactory appearance.
- (3) To maintain and enhance visual amenity.
- (4) To maintain and enhance visual amenity.
- (5) In the interests of preserving the character and appearance of the building.
- (6) In the interests of preserving the character and appearance of the building.
- (7) To ensure the satisfactory appearance of the Listed Building.

NOTE

1. If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the local planning authority to refuse listed building consent for the proposed works, or to grant consent subject to conditions, he may, by notice served within six months of receipt of this notice, appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment in accordance with part one Schedule 11 to the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971. The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of a notice of appeal and he will exercise his power in cases where he is satisfied that the applicant has deferred the giving of notice because negotiations with the local planning authority in regard to the proposed works are in progress.

2. If listed building consent is refused, or granted subject to conditions whether by the local planning authority or by the Secretary of State for the Environment, and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonably beneficial use in its existing state and cannot be rendered capable of reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any works which have been or would be permitted, he may serve on the council of the county district, in which the land is situated a listed building purchase notice requiring that council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Section 190 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971.

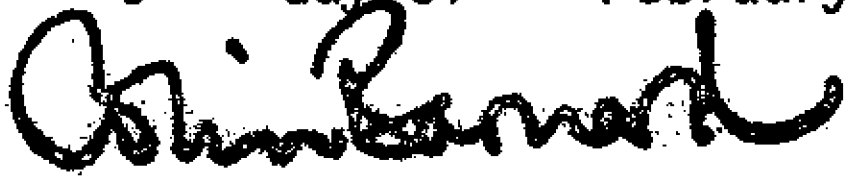
3. In certain circumstances, a claim may be made against the local planning authority for compensation, where permission is refused or granted subject to conditions by the Secretary of State on appeal or on a reference of the application to him. The circumstances in which such compensation is payable are set out in section 171 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971.

Attention is drawn to Section 55(2)(b) of the Act, the effect of which is that demolition may not be undertaken (despite the terms of the consent granted by the local planning authority) until notice of the proposal has been given to the Royal Commission on Historical Monuments, Fortress House, 23 Saville Row, London W1X 2HE, and the Commission subsequently have either been given reasonable access to the building for at least one month following the grant of consent, or have stated that they have completed their record of the building or that they do not wish to record it.

CONDITIONS /Cont'd...

- (4) All planting, seeding or turfing comprised in the approved details of landscaping, shall be carried out in the first planting and seeding seasons following the occupation of the buildings or the completion of the works, whichever is the sooner; and any trees or plants which within a period of five years from the completion of the works die, are removed or become seriously damaged or diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with others of similar size and species, unless the local planning authority gives written consent to any variation, and for the purposes of this condition a planting season shall be deemed to commence in any one year on 1 October and to end on 31 March in the next following year.
- (5) The details of landscaping referred to in condition 3 hereof shall include details of the layout of the inner courtyard and details of the proposed treatment of the boundaries of the site.
- (6) The doors, windows and chimney flue of the building shall be dark-stained or painted black.
- (7) Notwithstanding the details shown on drawing 654/AB(29)02B the boarding above the main entrance on the north-east elevation shall comprise horizontal weatherboarding to match the remainder of the building.
