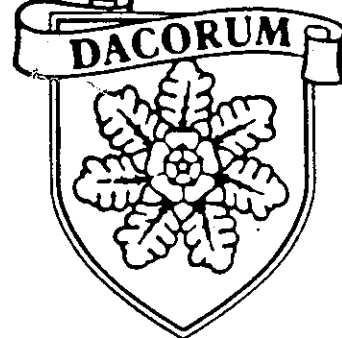

1. The works to which this consent relates shall be begun within a period of five years commencing on the date of this notice.

Reason: To comply with the provision of s.18 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.

2. All doors and ground floor windows to the development hereby permitted shall have a cambered brick arch constructed traditionally, without the use of permanent 'glass reinforced plastic' formers.

Reason: To ensure a satisfactory appearance.

3. All windows and doors shall be constructed of white painted timber.

Reason: To ensure a satisfactory appearance.

4. Only the central casement of the ground floor front window shall be opening.

Reason: To ensure a satisfactory appearance and match the existing ground floor living room window.

5. All brickwork shall match both in colour and texture that of the existing building of which this development shall form a part.

Reason: To ensure a satisfactory appearance.

6. All brickwork shall be constructed using lime mortar with rubbed flush joints.

Reason: To ensure a satisfactory appearance.

7. The roof of the development hereby permitted shall be finished in second-hand clay tiles to match the existing in colour, size, design and texture.

Reason: To ensure a satisfactory appearance.
