1. A scheme of landscaping, which shall include indications of existing and proposed trees and hedgerows on the land, shall be submitted to the local planning authority within six months of the date of this permission. The landscaping scheme shall include details of numbers, species and sizes of all new trees, shrubs and hedgerows.

Reason: To enhance the visual amenity of the area.

2. All planting comprised in the detailed landscaping scheme approved under condition 1 above shall be carried out in the first planting season following the approval of the landscaping scheme. If within a period of five years from the date of the planting of any tree, hedge or shrub that tree, hedge or shrub, or any tree hedge or shrub planted in replacement for it, is removed, uprooted or destroyed or dies (or becomes, in the opinion of the local planning authority, seriously damaged or defective,) another tree, hedge or shrub of the same species and size as that originally planted shall be planted at the same place, unless the local planning authority gives its written consent to any variation. for the purposes of this condition, a planting season shall commence on 1 October in any one year and end on 31 March in the next following calendar year.

<u>Reason</u>: To ensure a satisfactory appearance to the development and to safeguard the visual character of the immediate area.
