PROPOSED ERECTION OF 2.4 METRES HIGH STEEL PALLISADE SECURITY FENCE

WOODFIELD SCHOOL, MALMES CROFT HEMEL HEMPSTEAD Conditions to be Attached to Planning Permission (4/1563-95)

1. COLOUR

Before the fencing hereby permitted is erected, details of the colour in which the fence shall be initially painted and thereafter maintained shall have been submitted to and approved in writing by the County Planning Authority.

Reason: To minimise its visual impact on the surrounding area by ensuring that it is a dark green or similar dark colour.

2. LENTH AND HEIGHT OF FENCING

The permission hereby granted shall relate to a seventy-eight metres length of fencing along the school boundary from Malms Croft as far as the side boundary of the nearest property (number 7) in Colonsay rather than to the shorter distance shown on the submitted site location plan. Only the southern forty-five metres adjacent to the wooded area shall be 2.4 metres high, the remainder to the north shall be limited to two metres in height.

Reason: There is a discrepancy in the submitted application documents between the length of fencing referred to (78 metres) and its extent as indicated on the out-of-date submitted location plan, and to limit the highest part of the fencing to the most vulnerable part of site furthest from the public highway in Malms Croft.
