PROPOSED CLASSROOM EXTENSION POTTEN END FIRST SCHOOL, CHURCH ROAD, POTTEN END Conditions to be attached to planning permission (4/1595-94)

1. EXTERNAL APPEARANCE

The development hereby permitted shall not be commenced until details of the finish and colour of external materials have been submitted to and approved in writing by the County Planning Authority.

Reason: To ensure an appearance which is in keeping with the existing school building and appropriate to the school's location.

2. PROTECTION OF EXISTING TREES

Before any materials are brought onto the site or any development commenced, protective chestnut pale fencing or similar shall be erected around the two trees to the limit of their canopy adjacent to the development shown on drawing number 84/A/301 and maintained throughout the period of construction to the satisfaction of the County Planning Authority. There shall be no tipping or storage of materials within the fenced areas.

Reason: To ensure the undamaged survival of existing trees in the interests of the amenity of the area.

3. ACCESS AND PARKING ARRANGEMENTS

Contractors' vehicles shall use only the existing school access off Church Road, and for the duration of construction works both alternative separate temporary parking arrangements within the site shall be made for the parking of staff cars and also the existing pedestrian access off the Front shall be kept locked.

Reason: In order to minimise traffic congestion in Church Road and the Front and in the interests of pedestrian and vehicular safety.
