- (2) No part of the development hereby permitted shall be brought into use until visibility sight lines measuring:-

a) in respect of the northern access, 2.0m x 30m in a southerly direction and 2.0m x 19m in a northerly direction; and

- b) in respect of the southern access 2.0m x 30m in both directions as shown on drawing No. 1725/PD/SC (plan reference 4/1841/87) shall have been provided within which there shall be no obstruction more than 1 m above carriageway level and they shall be permanently maintained as so provided.
- (3) The development hereby permitted shall not be brought into use until the arrangements for vehicle parking and garaging shown on drawing No. 1725/PD/5/(plan reference 4/1841/87) shall have been provided and they shall not be used thereafter otherwise than for the parking and garaging of vehicles.

(1) If the applicant wishes to have an explanation of the reasons for this decision it will be given on request and a meeting arranged if necessary.

(2) If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the local planning authority to refuse permission or approval for the proposed development, or to grant permission or approval subject to conditions, he may appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment, in accordance with section 36 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within six months of receipt of the Environment, Marsham Street, London, S.W.1.) The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of a notice of appeal but he will not normally be prepared to exercise this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal. The Secretary of State is not required to entertain an appeal if it appears to him that permission for the proposed development could not have been granted by the local planning authority, or could not have been so granted otherwise than subject to the conditions imposed by them, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of the development order, and to any directions given under the order.

Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty and Conservation Areas. etc.) Special Development Orders 1985-1986 (or any order revoking and re-enacting those Orders), no development within Classes I and II of the said General Development Orders shall be carried out without the express permission of the local planning authority.
- 5. The development hereby permitted shall be constructed in materials as set out on drawing No. 1725/PD/SC (Plan 4/1841/87) or such other materials as may be agreed in writing with the local planning authority.
- 6. No development shall take place until there has been submitted to and approved by the local planning authority a scheme of landscaping, which shall include indications of all existing trees and hedgerows on the land, and details of any to be retained, together with measures for their protection in the course of development, and details of numbers, species and proposed planting location of all new trees shrubs and hedgerows.
- All planting seeding or turfing comprised in the approved details of landscaping, shall be carried out in the first planting and seeding seasons following the occupation of the buildings or the completion of the development, whichever is the sooner; and any trees or plants which within a period of 5 years from the completion of the development die, diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with others of similar size and species, unless the local planning authority gives written consent to any variation, and for the purposes of this condition a planting season shall be deemed to commence in any one year on 1 October and to end of 31 March in the next following year.
