

1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of five years from the date of this permission.

Reason: To comply with the requirements of Section 91 (1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

2. No development shall take place until samples of the materials to be used in the construction of the external surfaces of the development hereby permitted have been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. Development shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details.

Reason: To ensure a satisfactory appearance to the development.

3. The boundary hedge and trees adjacent to Rant Meadow shall be protected during the whole period of site excavation and construction. Details of the method of tree and hedge protection shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority prior to the commencement of any development hereby permitted.

Reason: In order to ensure that damage does not occur to the boundary hedge and trees during building operations.

4. If the boundary hedge or any tree to which Condition 3 applies is removed, uprooted, destroyed or dies, another hedge or tree shall be planted at the same place. The replacement planting shall be of such size and species, and shall be planted at such time, as may be specified in writing by the local planning authority.

Reason: To ensure a satisfactory appearance to the development and to safeguard the visual character of the immediate area.
