Brief description and location of proposed development.

In Pursuance of their powers under the above-mentioned Act and the Orders and Regulations for the time being in force thereunder, ~~and under the County of Hertford (Delegation of Planning Functions) Scheme, 1952,~~ the Council on behalf of the Local Planning Authority hereby permit the development proposed by you in your application dated 7th November 1962 and received with sufficient particulars on 9th November 1962 and shewn on the plan(s) accompanying such application, ⁸¹²⁰ subject to the following conditions :—


1. The use hereby authorised shall cease on the 31st December 1965 unless application is made to and approval granted by the local planning authority for its continued use after that date.
2. Reservation of land (shown hatched green on plan) for widening of St. Albans Road; such land to be used for car parking until the roadworks are put in hand.
3. The entrance to the car park from St. Albans Road be closed as soon as the road widening works are commenced.

PLEASE SEE NOTES OVERLEAF

The reasons for the Council's decision to grant permission for the development subject to the above conditions are :—

1. The proposed use is a temporary expedient only until such time as permanent development in accordance with the draft town map for Hemel Hempstead is practicable and to enable the local planning authority to reconsider the proposed use at the expiration of this temporary period in the light of circumstances prevailing at that time.
2. To ensure that the proposed development does not prejudice the future widening of St. Albans Road or prejudice the free flow of traffic or conditions of general safety along that road.

NOTE.

(1) If the Applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the local planning authority to refuse permission or approval for the proposed development, or to grant permission or approval subject to conditions, he may by notice served within one month of receipt of this notice, appeal to the Minister of Housing and Local Government in accordance with Section 16 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947. The Minister has power to allow a longer period for the giving of a Notice of Appeal and he will exercise his power in cases where he is satisfied that the applicant has deferred the giving of notice because negotiations with the local planning authority in regard to the proposed development are in progress. The Minister is not, however, required to entertain such an appeal if it appears to him that permission for the proposed development could not have been granted by the local planning authority, or could not have been so granted otherwise than subject to the conditions imposed by them, having regard to the provisions of Section 14 of the Act and of the Development Order and to any directions given under the Order.

(2) If permission to develop land is refused, or granted subject to conditions, whether by the local planning authority or by the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonably beneficial use in its existing state and cannot be rendered capable of reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted, he may serve on the Council of the County Borough or County District in which the land is situated a purchase notice requiring that Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with Section 19 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947.

(3) In certain circumstances, a claim may be made against the local planning authority or the Minister of Housing and Local Government for compensation, where permission is refused, or granted subject to conditions by the Minister on appeal or on a reference of the application to him. The circumstances in which such compensation is payable are set out in Section 20 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, and Part II of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1954.
