Brief description and location of proposed development.

In Pursuance of their powers under the above-mentioned Act and the Orders and Regulations for the time being in force thereunder, and under the ~~COUNCIL OF HERTFORD~~ (Delegation of Planning Functions) Scheme, 1952, the Council on behalf of the Local Planning Authority hereby permit the development proposed by you in your application dated 4th December 1961 and received with sufficient particulars on 8th March 1962 and shewn on the plan(s) accompanying such application, subject to the following conditions:—

1. The unmade portion of Christchurch Road to be made up in accordance with the Council's New Street bye-laws and Specification. The work to include a footpath on both sides of the carriageway and to take into consideration the future continuation of Christchurch Road into Icknield Way.
2. The developers to join a proposed scheme of private street works to be carried out by the Council in respect of Dunstrux.
3. Sufficient land to be dedicated to the Council in order to provide an adequate vision splay at the corner of Christchurch Road and Dunstrux.
4. A scheme of tree and shrub planting for the open space at the junction of the two roads to be submitted to the Local Planning Authority for their approval not later than six months after the commencement of the development hereby permitted and the scheme as approved shall be completed within one year after the date of such approval and thereafter maintained to the reasonable satisfaction of the local planning authority.

The reasons for the Council's decision to grant permission for the development subject to the above conditions are:—

1, 2 and 3. To meet the requirements of the Highway Authority.

4. In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality.

NOTE.

(1) If the Applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the local planning authority to refuse permission or approval for the proposed development, or to grant permission or approval subject to conditions, he may by notice served within one month of receipt of this notice, appeal to the Minister of Housing and Local Government in accordance with Section 16 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947. The Minister has power to allow a longer period for the giving of a Notice of Appeal and he will exercise his power in cases where he is satisfied that the applicant has deferred the giving of notice because negotiations with the local planning authority in regard to the proposed development are in progress. The Minister is not, however, required to entertain such an appeal if it appears to him that permission for the proposed development could not have been granted by the local planning authority, or could not have been so granted otherwise than subject to the conditions imposed by them, having regard to the provisions of Section 14 of the Act and of the Development Order and to any directions given under the Order.

(2) If permission to develop land is refused, or granted subject to conditions, whether by the local planning authority or by the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonably beneficial use in its existing state and cannot be rendered capable of reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted, he may serve on the Council of the County Borough or County District in which the land is situated a purchase notice requiring that Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with Section 19 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947.

(3) In certain circumstances, a claim may be made against the local planning authority or the Minister of Housing and Local Government for compensation, where permission is refused, or granted subject to conditions by the Minister on appeal or on a reference of the application to him. The circumstances in which such compensation is payable are set out in Section 20 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, and Part II of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1954.
