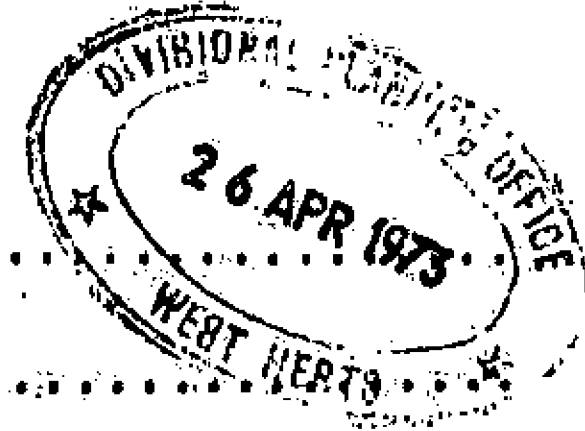

Brief description and location of proposed development.

In pursuance of their delegated powers under the above-mentioned Act and the Orders and Regulations for the time being in force thereunder, the Council on behalf of the Local Planning Authority hereby refuse the development proposed by you in your application dated 23rd February, 1973, and received with sufficient particulars on 1st March, 1973, and shewn on the plan(s) accompanying such application.

The reasons for the Council's decision to refuse permission for the development are:—

The site is in an area without notation on the County Development Plan where it is intended to permit only such development as would be appropriate within the neighbouring Metropolitan Green Belt. Within the approved Green Belt it is the policy of the local planning authority not to permit development except for agricultural or other essential purposes.

2 In the opinion of the local Planning authority the proposal represents undesirable new development in an area where green belt policies are applied.
